

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Oral Presentations are invited for the conference
- Abstracts should not exceed 300 words
- All submissions must be original and should not have been previously accepted for publication in any journal or presented in any other conference.
- The abstract should be in English and structured as per the following headings: background, method, results/findings, and conclusion.
- The abstract must include details of all authors, particularly their name, designation, affiliation, email address, and phone number. For co-authored work, please indicate the presenter's name.
- Group symposium presentations are also welcome. These should be 1 hour in duration with 4-5 presenters coordinated by one symposium chair. The symposium abstract should not exceed 1000 words and should include a brief introduction followed by individual abstracts. All abstracts must include the title, authors' names, and affiliations, and should be submitted as a single document by the symposium chair.
- Upon acceptance of your paper/poster/symposium, the presenters are required to complete the registration process by paying the associated fee in order to present their

research at the conference.

SUBMISSION PROCESS

- Abstract Submission: Participants must first submit an abstract for initial evaluation.
- Abstract Review: The submitted abstracts will be reviewed, and a selection will be made for presentation at the conference.
- Research Paper submission: Selected presented papers will be invited after the conference in the month of April 2025.
- Presentation Selection: After the presentations, the best ones, as determined by the organizers and academic committee, will be invited for full paper/manuscript
 - submission.
- Manuscript Review: The invited manuscripts will undergo a thorough review process. Reviewers/ editors may:
 1. Accept the paper as it is.
- 2. Request revisions for clarity, corrections, or edits if needed.
- 3. Reject the paper if it does not meet the required standards.
- Resubmission Opportunity: If revisions are requested, authors will have the chance to resubmit the manuscript after addressing the required changes. Acceptance is not guaranteed if the quality standards are still not met.
- Final Review: Accepted papers will undergo a final review by editors for minor adjustments before proceeding to publication.

• Decision Authority: The editors' decisions are final at every

process stage.
